

Lacy Airbrushed Flower-Pots



Materials Required:

Clay Flower-Pots

Lace Trim and/or Ribbon

Lace or Open Weave Tights

[Testors® Aztek® Airbrush](#)

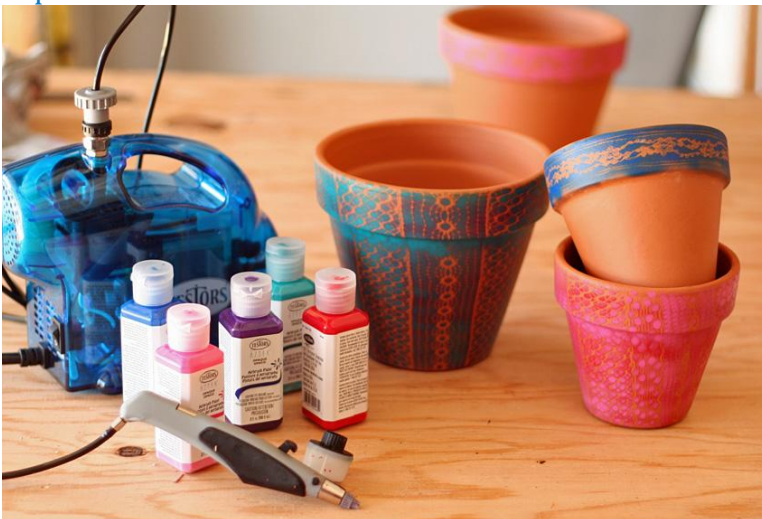
Testors® Aztek® Feed cups

[Testors® Aztek® Blue Mini Compressor](#)

[Testors® Aztek® Airbrushable acrylic paints](#) – colors of your choice

Newspaper (for masking off part of the flower pot)

Tape



Project Steps:

1. For the lace trimmed flower-pot, put your lace trim around the top part of the pot and secure with a small piece of tape. Cover the rest of the pot with newspaper to protect it from overspray.



2. Use the airbrush to paint over the lace, moving in even strokes from side-to-side. *Hint: Before you start working on the pots, test your lace on a piece of cardboard first, so you can see how well the details of the lace will show up and which paint colors look best with the terra cotta.*



3. Let the paint dry for a few minutes and then remove the lace.

4. To decorate a flower-pot with a lace design all over the pot, stretch the leg of a tight over the pot. Pull it tight and tuck the extra fabric inside the pot.
5. Airbrush the color of your choice, over the tights. If desired, you can layer a lighter color over a darker color for a two-tone effect. *Hint: Run a small amount of water through the airbrush in between colors and start a new color on the cardboard to make sure it is spraying clean.*



6. Let the paint dry before you remove the tights or you will smear the paint.
